- Review process identified that simplified Plan was required
- 5 Priorities from Survey and Meeting identified and 5 to Drive Plan initiated: Communication: Access to Open Spaces: Speeding and Road Safety: Village Cohesion: Dog Fouling and Fly Tipping. Annual Report devised
- 10 Councillors divided into 5 groups to focus on delivery
- Website and noticeboards updated with message
- Project budget devised as part of Precept
- Funding streams reviewed to support Precept to reduce financial impact on local residents
- Lottery identified as source and Bringing Llanddulas and Rhyd Y Foel Together Project initiated to focus on social cohesion
- £2500 secured and Stakeholder meeting arranged
- King's Coronation identified as social cohesion opportunity
- Village People volunteer group created with terms of reference
- Coronation Day Event organised by Village People supported by 2 Councillors
- Over 200 in attendance. Village People now permanent Group organising a number of other events locally in partnership with Church, Community Centre and British Legion
