

# Cwmaman Town Council Community Fridays Case Study

## At a glance

Cwmaman Town Council recognised that in a rural community residents face challenges accessing services. The purpose of their Community Fridays is to provide much needed support by bringing those organisations together. Allowing discussions with several locally based organisations, regional support agencies and third sector organisations, the initiative was launched with an open day at the Cwmaman Community Centre on February 23rd 2024.



### **Challenges**

Cwmaman Town Council realised that many of their residents were unaware of the range of support services available to them. They also identified that people were often unable to access this support due to barriers such as the cost of travel or social isolation.

- Community Fridays are attended by up to 50 people accessing community projects; advice and support from various organisations. This initiative consolidates crucial services under one roof, offering a one-stop support hub.
- The Community Café plays a crucial role in fostering social connections and enhancing the community life at the Cwmaman Community Centre. Clwb Bola Bach is a children's food club that is offered at the café providing nutritious and low-cost food options to families.
- The project welcomes volunteers from **Aman Care**, who are looking to integrate into the community, and students from the local comprehensive school who are working on their ALN time planner or accumulating volunteer hours for their Duke of Edinburgh awards.
- Reuse shop provided by **Eto** where people can purchase low cost refurbished items for their home including electricals, furniture, computers, paint and bikes.



## **Community Pantry**



The Community Pantry, located within the Cwmaman Community Centre, plays a vital role in supporting residents by providing low-cost quality food and emergency food parcels to those in need. This service is designed to alleviate food insecurity and ensure that everyone in the community has access to nutritious food. The pantry is integrated with Community Fridays, enhancing the support network available to local residents

# **Cwmaman celebrate National Volunteers Week**

A hugely successful event was supported by over 20 voluntary organisations promoting their projects and volunteering opportunities alongside Multiply, art, craft and wellbeing workshops. It was attended by approximately 120 people. It highlighted the vital role of volunteers and connected the community with meaningful opportunities to get involved.

# Funding & Powers

Providing the Community Fridays incurs minimal costs to the Council outside of usual staffing and building costs. Additional expenses are attached to the provision of resources and food for a larger community event.

All community councils in Wales need specific legal powers that enable them to provide various services and support for their local communities. These powers, granted by legislation, allow councils to undertake a wide range of activities and initiatives to improve the wellbeing and quality of life for residents. Powers and justifications can differ, and councils should consider their specific circumstances.
