#### TAKING STEPS TO ENSURE LLANDOUGH IS AN AGE FRIENDLY COMMUNITY

Everyone in Wales should be able to age well. In an age-friendly community older people feel valued, included and respected and can:

- do things that they want to do
- lead healthy and active lives

- have their voices heard

# Older Persons Survey <u>Comparison to 2021</u> <u>Survey</u>

### Comparison to 2021

% population replying to survey (based on 2021 census data)

- 2021 Survey 7.6%
- 2024 Survey 4.5%

More females responded than males in both surveys

- 2021 Survey M:F 1:1.3
- 2024 Survey M:F 1:1.6

The major issues seen in the 2024 survey were the same as those raised in 2021

- Local Services
- Community Transport
- Pavements
- Health & Social Services
- Your Voice

#### Comparison Major Issues

- Local Services same lowest level of satisfaction and % of respondents think it is worse than 2021
- Community Transport same lowest level of satisfaction and % of respondents think it is slightly better than 2021
- Pavements level of satisfaction spread from level 1, level 7 and level 8 with regards satisfaction, but level 1 showed majority of respondents think the situation is worse than 2021. Maybe the spread of levels depends on where the respondent lived?
- Health & Social Services same lowest level of satisfaction and % of respondents think it is worse than 2021
- Your Voice same lowest level of satisfaction and % of respondents think it is worse than 2021

- During coffee morning invite Citizen's Advice for pension credit discussion and other benefits that could be claimed.
- Invite PCSO to coffee morning to discuss issues
- Survey footpaths through and around Llandough
- Put in new benches and tables in Cogan Pill playing area

#### <u>Actions:</u>

- Talk to headmaster about expanding range and opening hours
- Talk to hospital management about the possibility of a pharmacy at hospital
- Talk to Jason Conibeer Capita; Planning Support Manager, Cardiff & Vale Health Board about possibility of a local pharmacy at proposed new East Vale Health Hub
- Elderfit have sessions every Tuesday publicise more and and ask organiser to possibly run more sessions
- Contact groups such as Citizen's Advice to attend monthly coffee mornings to discuss issues of concern
- Send monthly invitation to PCSO to attend monthly coffee mornings to discuss issues of concern
- Ask Ramblers Association to assess and survey local footpaths and attend coffee mooring to present findings
- Ask scout/guide association about modernising old scout hut and form new scout/guide group.
- Ask VoG to put new benches and tables in Cogan Pill playing area

#### **Proposals:**

- Parking
  - Major issue in Llandough work with hospital and PCSO to address
- Pavements
  - More crossing points needed and repair any damaged areas
- Cogan Pill
  - Re-surface and clean
- Highways
  - Come under VoG jurisdiction

#### <u>Actions</u>

- Work with hospital to reemphasise to park within hospital grounds
- Ask Councillor George Carroll to push parking issues with VoG and highway issues
- Ask PSCO to monitor parking on pavements
- Ask VoG to:
  - Put crossing into King George V playing fields at former road narrowing on Leckwith Road and crossing from Leckwith Road to Greenway Avenue
  - Survey pavements throughout Llandough and repair as needed
- Ask VoG to re-surface Cogan Pill
- Send concerns to Environment and Amenities committee to discuss and come forward with further action plan
